

In & Around The Garden

July is changeover time in the garden. Early flowering plants, such as alliums, anthemis and some of the hardy geraniums need cutting back or tidying up before they set seed or swamp their neighbours. Some may flower again later in the year, but new plants are having their turn to shine. Day lilies buds are starting to open, and the flowers are big and beautiful. I particularly like Pink Damask (pictured) and Marion Vaughan, which has big yellow trumpets and a lovely scent. Some of the spectacular American hybrids flower earlier, but the buds can be infested and destroyed by hemerocallis gall midge. The later



varieties generally escape this nasty little pest. Although each flower lasts just one day, they open in succession. My Pink Damask has 16 flower stems, each with up to 16 buds, so the display lasts for weeks.



Veronicas (speedwells) are a genus that seldom features in gardening programmes. One species is a common lawn weed, but other members of the group are beautiful garden plants, and I grow several different ones. The first to flower is a ground cover plant with dark blue flowers in spring. Another early one, the gentian speedwell, has a flat rosette of leaves and a foot high stem bearing typical speedwell flowers with four blue petals and a white eye. The summer flowering varieties have long conical heads of tiny deep blue-purple flowers, and could be mistaken for salvias

from a distance. The smallest grows on the rockery with flower stalks just 4 inches high. The tallest reaches around five feet. There are also some pink varieties, although I prefer the dramatic contrast offered by the dark blue amongst other summer perennials. They all seem to be perfectly hardy and pest free, and are well worth a try.

A cautionary tale – some brown patches have appeared on part of the lawn near the shed. On closer inspection I found they were the same size and shape as my footprints. A few weeks earlier I had used weed killer on the worn grass path to the shed, in preparation for paving it. I waited until the spray had dried before walking on the area, but still managed to transfer some to my shoes and to the surrounding lawn. Oops! Luckily there wasn't enough on my shoes to kill the grass completely and the brown patches are starting to fill in, but I'll be more careful in future.

One cool, damp morning I noticed that hoverflies were out in force. Most of them were small, with bands of yellow, black and white across the abdomen. There were very few bees about, but the little hoverflies were on lots of different flowers, mostly eating pollen. Unlike the bumble bees, they didn't crawl inside tubular flowers such as foxgloves, but seemed particularly fond of the big anthers of the day lilies. They are useful pollinators, and the larvae of many species eat aphids, so they are always welcome. **JA**

Using slides as illustration, Don took us through his many memorable encounters with 'Glorious Gardens', 'Visionary Views', 'Fabulous Flowers' and several other alliterative categories. His cheerful delivery and obvious enthusiasm for the natural world made for an entertaining evening.

It was with great regret that the committee decided that the annual flower show should be cancelled again this year, as the crowds that it attracts could not be managed safely in an indoor venue. An alternative event for members only will take place later this month.

The September meeting of the society will be held in Carton Scroop Village Hall on August 10th at 6:45pm for 7:00pm. The speaker, Trevor Rogers, will give a talk on pruning. Members will be notified of any changes to the program by email. Unfortunately we cannot accommodate visitors at this meeting. LCC UPDATE SUMMER 2021

Further investment in Highway maintenance

We are proposing to invest an additional £10m in Highway maintenance this year, which comes in addition to the £12.3m we invested from reserves to make good the



25% reduction from Government for 2021/22. This funding takes the total highways maintenance budget to £61m this year. The investment has been possible because the cost of delivering council services was less than forecast last year. We will be targeting the additional funds on our B roads and minor roads, and where possible we will be rebuilding and resurfacing and not just filling potholes.

The last of 33 new Scania appliances was recently delivered to Waddington, marking the end of an £8m roll out of new fire engines and equipment put into service across Lincolnshire. Moving on, Caythorpe next met North Scarle, who they defeated by 4 wickets. Batting first, N. Scarle amassed a decent score of 218 for 5 wickets. They probably thought that was enough, but Caythorpe managed to win with just two balls of the match remaining. Sandy Ireland hit 54. Our Senior Coach, Vince Markham, making a rare appearance as some of our younger players were injured or in Covid quarantine, added 38, and Captain James King hit a quickfire 35 not out to seal the victory.

The next game was the keenly awaited local "derby", against Barkston & Syston. Batting first, returning after a broken arm, Joe Dickinson scored 58 out of a Total of 160 all Out. Barkston were bowled out for only 81 runs, with Dan Pinfold leading the bowling with 5 wickets for 24 runs, ably supported by Alex Dickinson (also still an Under 15) who captured 3 early wickets for 9 runs.

Our Juniors are almost at the end of their Season, with the Under 15's currently leading the County table. Depending on other Team's results Caythorpe will either share, or hopefully be outright Winners. Since next year all of the Players will have moved out of Junior Cricket it is magnificent for the Club to see them finish their Junior career with such a tremendous result - and to have several already excelling in Senior Cricket - a tribute to our Coaches over several years.

Not from the Rectory

A day when the rector was sent to Coventry by way of Nuneaton and Rugby!

The idea for the day had come when, by chance, we watched a BBC documentary on the building of the new cathedral in the aftermath of the Second World War. It brought into our mind childhood trips to look with awe and wonder at this new building – in my case this would have been a visit with mother on a Mothers' Union outing where we joined a 'procession' some 4 if not 5 abreast moving as a single mass around the cathedral.

A day trip from Grantham involves many changes of train but with the simple expedient of taking the Cross-Country train from Stamford there is one single change of train at Nuneaton – or that, at least, was the plan!

We met our friends at Stamford and travelled together on the Birmingham train as far as Nuneaton only to find the onward train was for some un-specified reason not going to run! The helpful staff directed us to a Euston train for the journey south to Rugby where we had to change to a north bound service for Birmingham to arrive into Coventry some 30 minutes late.

With a taxi we were however still in time to attend one half of the lunch time service of Holy Communion – indeed the arrival of 4 additional members of the congregation boosted the attendance, so we were told, to the best it had been [12] since they had resumed offering this service as Covid rules relaxed!



After the service there was ample time to wander around the cathedral [while the organist played the Sinfonia from Cantata 29 by J S Bach 'We thank thee, God, we thank thee] and take in the Graham Sutherland tapestry of 'Christ in Majesty'-though for my money it is the John Piper window in the Baptistery which draws the eye with its blaze of light symbolising the Holy Spirit and merits Pevsner's accolade that it is 'among the best glass of the twentieth century'.



Stepping outside we could see the Jacob Epstein figure of St Michael and the Devil and the way in which Basil Spence linked the old cathedral, destroyed in the bombing of 14th November 1940 to the new cathedral built on a north-south axis using the available ground.

It fell to our Stamford friends to source the best place for lunch and with the help of a city guide from the cathedral we walked to 'Playwrights' at the Canal Basin which afforded a seemingly rural location in the centre of a commercial and industrial city.

No visit to Coventry would be complete without encountering that most famous citizen – Lady Godiva whose plinth proclaims that she rode forth clad only with her own chastity!



And from the upper floor of the 'Cosy Club' we enjoyed her hourly repetition of that famous ride to save the citizens of Coventry from her husband's crippling taxes!

Prayer Book evensong in the cathedral sung by the girls' choir [of 15] drew a congregation of 12 and was a beautiful and peaceful way in which to draw our visit to a close – all that remained was a taxi to the station for the direct North Western service from Coventry to Nuneaton and the onward Cross-Country train to bring

us back to Stamford and to our car for the journey home in the rain!

In words from the Coventry Litany of Reconciliation – Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.




