NEWS FROM VICKY WILKINSON GLASS

An elegant fusion of art and innovation



Vicky Wilkinson has been hard at work, crafting a new collection of glass jewellery, introducing a unique approach she's been perfecting. Her process involves three distinct stages that breathe life into glass.

Beginning with coloured sheet glass, Vicky cuts and layers complementary colours, then kiln fires them at around 800°C. This first phase sets the groundwork. The next step entails resizing the fired pieces, shaping them anew, and firing them once more, setting the stage for the final touch. In the culminating phase, the glass pieces are subjected to weight from kiln shelves and bricks.

This ingenious method compresses the glass, resulting in lightweight and finely blended pieces, each boasting a mesmerising painterly effect. The result is a collection of elegantly coloured pendants and earrings, astonishingly light to wear.

All these pieces are handcrafted in Vicky's shop/studio and are now available to buy. Additionally, she will be showcasing her creations at the upcoming Caythorpe Gala on September 2nd. So come along and see for yourself Vicky's new jewellery collection

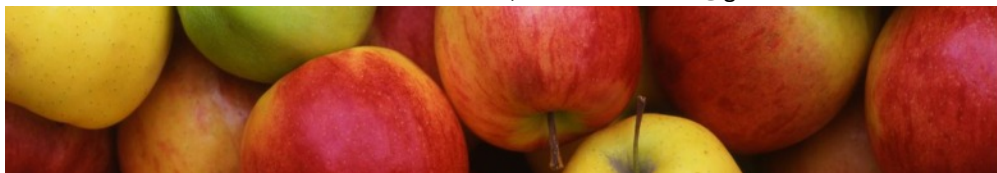

APPLES WANTED! FEED OUR PRESS, NOT THE WASPS!

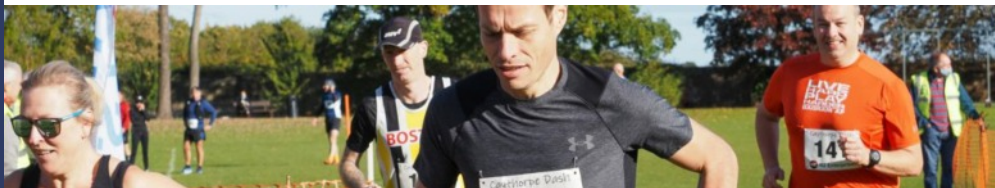

ENCOUNTERS

Recounted by Brian Lucas, The Last Rector of Caythorpe & Fulbeck

SINDEN, CBE, Sir Donald



Crossing the Cathedral Green in Llandaff one morning in 1966 I noticed the Dean in conversation with a man I did not recognise, and when the Dean introduced him as “our man at Saint Mark’s”, as the next parish was called St Marks Gabalfa, and was in interregnum, I assume the man was new Rector. Later that morning the Dean told me that “The Man” was the actor Donald Sinden playing the title role in the TV sitcom, “Our Man at St Mark’s”, and was appearing in a play in the New Theatre in Cardiff, called “There’s a Girl in My Soup” before it moved to the London West End. The Dean, Eryl Thomas, also failed to recognise him outside the Cathedral and had invited him to lunch at the Deanery, to which I was invited. It was a delightful occasion, full of laughter and theatrical anecdotes.

He later delighted the nation as the Butler in the television series “Two’s Company” with Elaine Stritch as his employer, and when he was awarded the CBE, I phoned him to congratulate him and asked if Miss Stritch was impressed. He replied that she was, and he was so thrilled with the honour that he wore it on his pyjamas! When we went to see him playing opposite Miriam Margolis in “She Stoops to Conquer” in the West End in 1993 he invited us backstage after the performance. Three years later he suffered the death of his elder son Jeremy, and I wrote to him again in 2006 when his devoted wife Diana died.

He told me the strange story of his cousin’s grave. His company were taking a Shakespearian play on tour in Germany, but he decided to travel separately by car because his cousin, who died in the war was buried near Dusseldorf where the play was to open. He had only the name of the cemetery but no directions. He passed an RAF base and stopped to ask for help. The guard recognised him and sent for the Station Commander who took him to the Officers’ Mess. Maps of the area were brought but no mention of this cemetery were found until an elderly German clerk in the map store heard the name. He explained that it was the original name of a nearby burial ground which was renamed after the war. As it was late, he accepted the offer of a room in the Mess and set off after breakfast with detailed directions. Since leaving UK he had been thinking of an appropriate epitaph to leave at his cousin’s grave; he struggled to think of a striking quotation from Shakespeare, but all that kept coming into his mind was, “*Good night sweet prince*”, from the final scene of “Hamlet”, which he considered too trite. However, as he arrived at the gate of the cemetery he wrote, reluctantly, that quotation on the card attached to his wreath. He found the grave which he had longed to see, and as he stooped to lay his wreath he saw, engraved long ago on the headstone, the words, ““*Good night sweet prince*”.

He was always scintillating company, and his humility was reflected in his membership of the charity "Friends of Friendless Churches." As the President of the Garrick Club, he enthralled members of the Savage Club when he paid a visit as my guest. Sir Donald died at his home in Wittersham on the Isle of Oxney, Kent, on 12 September 2014, aged 90, from prostate cancer. He was cremated in a coffin painted in the Garrick Club's 'salmon and cucumber' colours.

Barbie: SYNOPSIS : *To live in Barbie Land is to be a perfect being in a perfect place, unless someone is a Ken or having a full-on existential crisis.*

Her: I don't think I'd have chosen to see this film if I wasn't reviewing it as I'm not generally very tolerant of musicals, however, I was assured there wasn't too much singing and synchronised dancing and there was part of me that was wondering what all the hype was about. I'm so glad that we saw this film. The set is just what every small, or older (no judgement here) person who enjoys playing Barbies would expect to see, it's plastic fantastic and is filmed as if a person was playing with toys - what a brilliant thought process. There were ingenious laugh out loud moments and both Margot Robbie and Ryan Gosling played their parts so well. 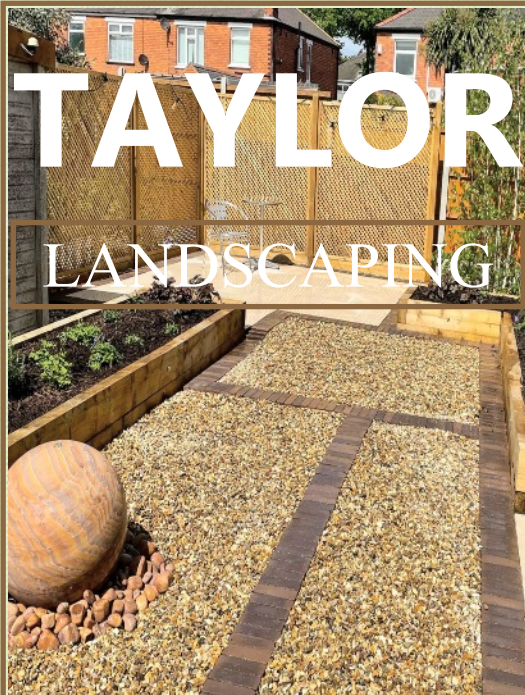

Carlton Scroop & Normanton On Cliffe Parish Council News

The Parish Council discussed a number of issues at its meeting on 31 July, the main two were speeding through the two villages and recent incidents at the travellers' site in Carlton Scroop. Speeding in the two villages: The new 30mph speed limit on the A607 through Carlton Scroop is now in force which is in line with the speed limit in Normanton. The two electronic radar signs in Carlton Scroop have to be replaced at a significant cost to the Parish Council. It is clear that motorists are not obeying the speed limits in either village, and Lincolnshire Police has agreed to undertake speed checks, in a similar way to nearby villages. Extra "check your speed" signs have been erected in both villages. The Speed Indicator Device (SID) has been deployed in order to make motorists aware of their speed through the villages and the Parish Council is looking at purchasing a second SID.

Travellers' site at Carlton Scroop: There have been two serious incidents at the site in the past few months which have been attended by Lincolnshire Police and the District Council. The site is still contravening planning conditions. There were no police officers available to attend the last Parish Council meeting but the Community Beat Manager has assured residents that there are no concerns to the general public in relation to the recent police presence.

Other Community Issues: A bench has been purchased to install in Heath Lane, Normanton and a further bench is to be purchased for the new cemetery at Carlton Scroop. There are a number of dead trees that need to be removed from the Jubilee Field. The Parish Council is also currently reviewing the areas of grass cutting undertaken by the District Council. The Parish Council is looking for someone who can spend a couple hours a month litter picking in the two villages. This would be a paid position so please contact the Parish Clerk if you can help in any way.

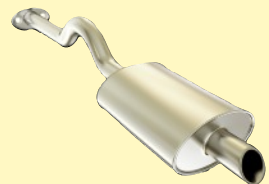

Teddy Bear Parachute Drop, St Vincent's Church, Caythorpe



On Saturday 15th July over 50 gallant and brave Teddy Bears lined up to register for their parachute drop from the tower of St Vincent's Church, Caythorpe. After receiving a number, they mustered for the issue of parachutes and were then transported to the top of the tower. A soldier from 216 (Parachute) Signal Squadron was on hand to marshal the excited bears and launch them from the tower with instructions to miss the headstones on the graves below.

Upon landing, the stretcher parties, provided by the Beavers and Cubs of the 1st Caythorpe and Duke's Covert, gathered up the wounded bears and took them to the first aid post, where their injuries were assessed, bandaged and splinted as required! They

were then delivered back to their anxious owners, presented with a certificate for bravery and taken to enjoy tea and cake in the church to recuperate! Some keen and fit bears went back for more excitement, including Longshaw, Reverend Stuart Hadley's bear, who made 4 jumps in total (see top photo), and narrowly avoided being trapped on the chancel roof, before making a bit for freedom into a neighbouring garden!

A great day was had by all, notwithstanding the strong winds, which would have deterred normal soldiers and the rain held off until later. With a book stall, cake stall, tombola and raffle, a total of £424 was made for church funds.

St Vincent's has held 5 teddy bear parachute drops over the last 15 years, starting in 2008 when Revd. June Freshney was Rector of the Parish. It is particularly appropriate for



Caythorpe, as the village has a strong historical connection to the Para's, dating back to the Second World War, and many of their battles and engagements are commemorated in two stained glass windows in St Vincent's church.

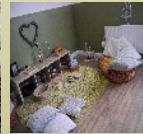

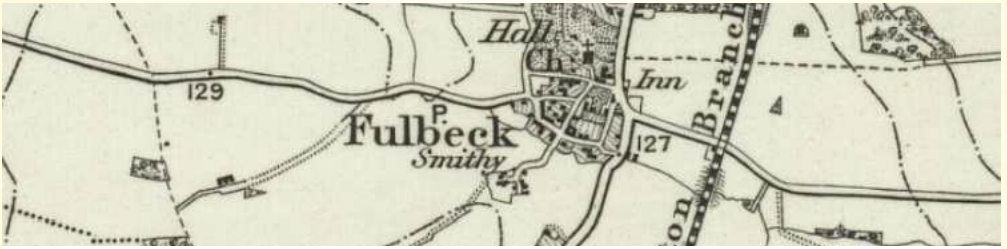

The Memories of Augustus Peach (part III)

More thoughts from Augustus Peach who lived in Fulbeck at the turn of the 19th/20th century. His family were poor, so he provides a vivid picture from that perspective. This valuable and informative historical document will be reproduced pretty much in full (I am leaving out most of Augustus' poetry) without any attempt correct errors or grammar.

I was not taught at school anything relating to the history of the village or of its ancient landmarks. Most of the cottages are of white local stone built up to the roadway, many of these cottages having steps to the one and only door, without a little frontage of garden.

There is no doubt if history could give us the facts, how the village was first planned and its site chosen it would tell us that caves were dug in the hillsides connected by paths, dug out, and gradually widened in time, and as the village folk progressed, the caves replaced by houses. Several of the cottages to this day have one side soil up to the bedroom windows, and the roads on the hillsides channeled out with stone walls built up to hold the soil behind six feet above the road level. You can see its mounded fields, its stone cross, hear the names of its fields and old cottage yards, all speaking history.

The three village greens may have a history, these may have been parish pounds, especially the one by the village hall surrounded by chains and the Northend green. Their use was necessary previous to the enclosing of fields where cultivated strips or open fields were common and uncultivated land had a common use for the community of the village. Then there had to be an enclosure for stray cattle, and later it showed up the farmer who did not keep his fence in repair. In my young days these greens were used for the lane cows to collect. The lane cows belonged to the smallholder or cottage farm labourer several of the latter owning a cow or two. In the Spring and Summer about ten to twenty cows would be brought by these individual cowkeepers and herded on the village green then to be given over to the control of an elderly citizen who would tend these cattle on country lanes, alternating daily for seven days a week to the Lowfields and then to the Heath lanes from six in the morning until six in the evening, for one shilling a week each cow. Alas the coming of the motor car brought an end to this cheap method of milk production, and the added increment to the cowkeeper's already low wages as a labourer. In my early days one of these cow tenders was Billy King. His name also recalls to my mind a stalwart of the Primitive Methodist Chapel whom along with William Jackson (I believe a tablet can be seen in the chapel to his memory) upheld and controlled its services. The Wesleyan Chapel perhaps a little more popular was under the supervision of farmer Henry Hutchinson.

As I remember at the time of the turn of the century, the village folk could be classified ...

under the various headings ARISTOCRAT gentry or idle rich, aristocratic specialists, public school trained i.e. Doctor, Vicar, and Gentleman Farmers. TRADESMEN of the village along with the Farm Foremen, Head Gardener, Head Coachmen. ORDINARY LABOURER the poor hard working slave.

Birth and wealth controlled the status of your position and your patronage to either give or take. Even one of the social pleasures of the rich was to give charity to the poor, in the form of coal and other commodities in order to gain respect and prominence. This in fact was a splendid action and brought much relief to many a poor soul in poverty and distress; probably Dr. Johnson’s words were remembered by some individuals "A decent provision for the poor is the true test of civilisation." Perhaps there may be something in the saying "When the rich assemble to concern themselves with the business of the poor it is called charity, but when the poor assemble to concern themselves with the business of the rich it is called anarchy."

The lesson my young life had taught me, is to see that anyone in poor circumstances, from no fault of their own, is to give them all the help and sympathy, and your reward will surely and unmistakably appear in the long run.
