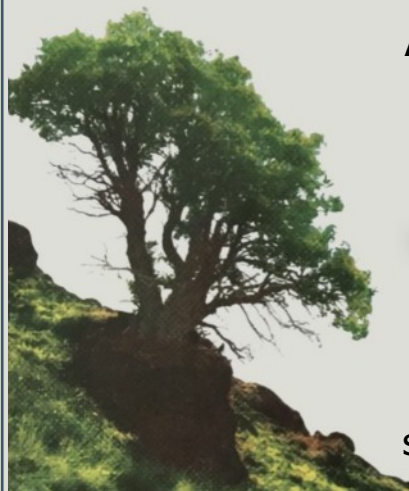
So that's all from us, hopefully we will see you at the Gala, come over and say Hello and have a chat, we wont bite! Until next time, Laura & Pete.

ENCOUNTERS

Recounted by Brian Lucas, The Last Rector of Caythorpe & Fulbeck

Major-General A.J. (Tony) DEANE-DRUMMOND, CB, DSO, MC & Bar

It is September, and once again we welcome our friends from No. 216 Parachute signals squadron. When I was appointed Rector of the Caythorpe Benefice in 1996 it was a great pleasure to welcome this splendid body of men to their Annual Parade and Church Service of remembrance here in Saint Vincent's Church. The Parade made up of about 50 serving soldiers and about 160 veterans of Operation Market Garden formed up outside the Village Hall in the High Street, and marched up to the church, with the senior officer present taking the Salute at the dais near the Surgery. Throughout my time as Rector, the salute was taken by Major General Deane-Drummond, with Colonel Lewis Golden beside him.



Born in 1917, the son of Colonel J.D. Deane-Drummond DSO, OBE, MC, Anthony was educated at Marlborough College and the Royal Military Academy, Woolwich. He joined the Army after leaving Woolwich and was commissioned into the Royal Corps of Signals in 1937.

During the Second World War, Deane-Drummond served in Europe and in North Africa; he volunteered for Commando duty, and was assigned as second-in-command of the force which participated in Operation Colossus, an airborne raid on southern Italy in February 1941. Although the raid successfully destroyed its target (the Tragino Aqueduct), every member of the unit was taken prisoner by Italian forces.

After unsuccessful plans in June and July had to be called off, Deane-Drummond managed to escape from captivity in December. After being recaptured near the Swiss border, he was held in an Italian prisoner-of-war camp for several months before being transferred to a hospital in Florence in May 1942. He escaped from there in June and made it to Switzerland. He then was taken to southern France and was picked up by the Royal Navy in mid-July 1942. He received the Military Cross for his successful escape. He relates this Italian campaign in full in his book, "Return Ticket."

On his return to England, Deane-Drummond was posted to the newly-formed 1st Airborne Division and saw service in Operation Market Garden as second-in-command of the divisional signals. He became separated from his unit whilst trying to link up with 1st Parachute Brigade, who were surrounded at the north end of Arnhem Bridge, and along with three other soldiers spent three days trapped in a tiny unused room at the back of a German-occupied Guardroom.

On managing to leave this building, they split up to cross the Rhine.; Deane–Drummond successfully swam to the south bank of the Rhine but was almost immediately taken prisoner. The next day, he managed to escape from a group who were being escorted out of Arnhem and spent the next eleven days hiding inside a large cupboard until he felt safe to move. After leaving his hiding place, Deane-Drummond made contact with the Resistance, and waited two weeks until he was brought back to British lines as part of Operation Pegasus. He was mentioned in despatches for this second escape and awarded a bar to his Military Cross.

During my early years as Rector of the parish the Saturday afternoon Gala was followed by the Reunion Dinner, which was held at Caythorpe Court, where the Veterans were accommodated for the weekend. There was a long top-table supporting five sprigs, Making an average of 200 diners. Joy and I were invited as guests each year and were seated either side of Tony Dean-Drummond, with Colonel Lewis the other side of Joy; the officers and guests completed the top-table. It was always a lively occasion!

After dinner one year Tony excused himself to Joy and stood up. He pointed to a veteran seated on one of the sprigs, who at once stood to attention in his place. " You!" he said, "move to the door." There was complete silence in the dining room as the two men met at the door to the room they embraced each other, and turning to the assembly Deane-Drummond explained, "This soldier was my driver and having escaped from captivity at Arnhem we made it to the Rhine, where we shook hands wished each other luck and dived into the fast flowing current, I made it across the river and was again captured, but I never saw this man again until now. I thought he was dead. " After a short, stunned silence there was an outburst of loud applause, as the two men regained their seats. It was the most moving episode and a true reunion.

As we left Caythorpe Court to return to the village, Joy unlocked the car door for me but before I could take my seat the car was filled with five veterans requesting a lift to the Waggon and Horses! I nodded to Joy and waited patiently for her to return for another load. They had not lost their touch!

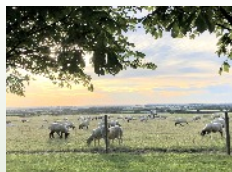

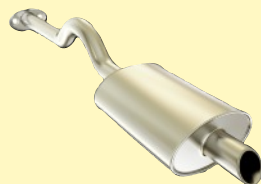

On Monday 17th June, Village Life Was Disrupted By A Bomb Scare!

The police were called to the discovery of a mortar round in a house in the High Street. An evacuation of local residents was conducted and the High Street closed from outside the Village Hall to the Waggon and Horses.

Residents were evacuated to either the Village Hall (where Paul Godfrey served teas and coffee), or the Red Lion pub where Becky Hall served free soft drinks and crisps to the children as well as drinks to the adults.

EOD (army bomb disposal) were called and after assessing the threat, removed it to the beet pad on Gorse Hill where a controlled explosion was carried out.

After the removal of the shell, residents were allowed to return to their properties.

It is understood that the mortar round may have been a souvenir of the time a previous resident spent in the forces. It is apparently not uncommon for such souvenirs to be taken home, so if you or someone you know has such a potentially dangerous object tucked away, please **DO NOT MOVE IT** and contact the police for advice.

It also prompted the Parish Council to undertake a review of our emergency plan which was found to need updating.

What's happening in Carlton Scroop & Normanton Parish Council

The Parish Council met on 30th July to discuss the local Parish Plan and a number of other local issues.

The Parish Plan: The Parish Council produced a Parish Plan in 2022 following a survey with residents. The current Plan can be found on the Council's website. Most of the actions from that Plan have now been achieved, so it is an appropriate time to review and update the document. The Parish Council would like to hear from residents on what they would like to see take place in the next few years. This is your opportunity to influence what can happen in the two villages. So please contact the Clerk or a parish councillor if you have any thoughts on what should be happening in the Parish.

Highway issues in the two villages : Lincolnshire County Council is planning to re-surface the highway between the south side of Carlton Scroop and the level crossing at Honnigton, commencing in May 2025. The Parish Council has requested that the section of highway between the level crossing and the junction of the A153 also be re-surfaced.

Speeding continues to be a big issue through the two villages. The Parish Council is particularly concerned about speeding along the Sudbrook Road on the stretch from Charity Street to the junction of the A607, where several accidents have occurred recently. This stretch is still at 50 mph and the Parish Council has requested that it be brought in line with the 30 mph speed limit in the rest of the village. The mobile Speed Indicator Device (SID) will continue to be deployed in the Parish in order to make motorists aware of their speed through both villages. The Parish Council has a stock of 30 mph bin stickers available for residents. Please contact the clerk or a parish councillor for the stickers, or come and pick them up at the Parish Council Meeting. The Parish Council continues to push for a footpath between Carlton Scroop and Normanton as part of the County Council's Sustainable Travel Initiative.

Jubilee Field/Cemetery, Carlton Scroop: The hedging around the field is to be trimmed in the autumn. The grass has been maintained by Baines Estates. The cemetery grass is being maintained by David Balfe who also donated a bench. The hedging is to be trimmed in the autumn.

Other Community Issues: The Parish Council re-appointed South Kesteven District Council to cut the grass around the Parish for the current grass cutting season. However, councillors have expressed their dissatisfaction with the quality and consistency of the grass cutting so far and will monitor the work for the remainder of the season. A bench has been installed in Heath Lane, Normanton. A big thank you to Richard Harris from Carlton Scroop, who has stepped forward to spend a couple hours a month litter picking in the two villages. More volunteers would be appreciated. The Parish Council has a contract in place for emptying the 5 dog bins in the two villages. The two existing defibrillators at Normanton and Carlton Scroop are to be replaced between now and Spring 2025. An additional Defibrillator is to be installed on the external wall at the Village Hall in Carlton Scroop in the next few weeks and this will be partly financed by the Carlton Scroop Charities. The Parish Council is to obtain quotes to replace the roof on the bus stop shelter opposite Newark Lane, Carlton Scroop.

Village Hall & Social Club: The Village Hall at Carlton Scroop is available for hire by individuals or groups. Please contact carltonscroopvillagehall@gmail.com if you want to hire the Hall. The Village Hall Committee is still looking for someone interested in taking on a paid role

for some general caretaking tasks (cleaning and opening/locking up). Please contact Nigel Hill on 07957424453 if you would like to get involved. The cosy **Social Club** in the Village Hall is open on a Friday & Saturday 7:30pm to 10:30pm – all welcome.

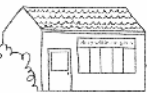

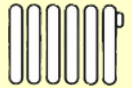

The Memories of Augustus Peach (part XII)

This month we start to hear about the various tradespeople of the village from Augustus Peach, who lived in Fulbeck at the turn of the 19th/20th century. This valuable and informative historical document is reproduced pretty much in full without any attempt correct errors or grammar. And don't forget our special guest coming to the Thursday Club!

Every village has its own outstanding characters.

The Village Barber, Tailor and General Adviser

Even to this day I think of the wonderful "Gaffer Jinks", John Else Jenkinson. A splendid bass singer, a member of the Church choir for over fifty years, a barber, a taxidermist, his stuffed birds and animals beautifully set up and cased found homes all over the country. A tailor, performing all these skilled duties in his one outbuilding, hot, smoky and ill-ventilated.

A very thoughtful and clever man, his reasoning powers were generally developed above the average man even of today. His shop was the repository for the gossip of the village, a kind of local parliament and well fitted him as the newspaper's local news representative. Snuff taking was one of his failings, carrying traces on his waistcoat. A click in church, it was Gaffer's snuff box followed by a strong sniff of the nose. Saturday was his busy day with shaving and haircutting.

The Village Shoemaker

The shoemaker waxes his thread.

"Snobby Jinks", no relation to Gaffer, his real surname was Jenkinson his little cobbler's shop situated on a corner near to the school, attracted the youths who would watch him sitting on his low stool cum bench, his teeth gripping the tacks used as a third hand, whilst his own hands employed in hammering and holding. His bucket of dark liquid by his side in which he soaked his leather to soften it and by hammering to close up the pores. When the boyish onlookers lost interest in looking through his window; turned their backs to enter into conversation among themselves blocking out the shoemaker's light, Snobby would stealthily climb his ladder, open the window and pour water on to the assembly. This, he would say afterwards, was Sam Frisk and Joe Boss up to their tricks again. Our shoemaker had a small holding providing many of the villagers with milk at a penny a pint and with his horse and trap take and fetch folk from the station at a shilling a journey. Long days of toil in those days but always a smile and a joke. I remember a wooden post situated on the corner of the street and footpath in line with Snobby's front door, new boys were encouraged to try their skill with stones to hit the post, misses would invariably hit the door and bring out the cobbler to make protestations. Honey collection was one of his sidelines and during the bee swarming season you would see him arrayed in a bowler hat with muslin hanging down fastened around

the brim covering his head and shoulders and knocking on a dustpan with a stone preparing to take a swarm from one of his fruit trees.

The Hand of the Law

We had no village policeman, the constable from Caythorpe would meet the Leadenham sergeant on the corner by the post office and both after a friendly greeting and a short wait would return to their villages. One Winter's night a village lad had occasion to go to a concert at the next village school. Leaving the concert he found he had forgotten to take his cycle lamp. In order to be sure of riding home without meeting the arm of the law, he called at the house of the constable and concocted a story that his father required a licence to dip sheep. He saw the constable at home make the enquiry, to be told he should go over to the sergeant's in the next village the other side of his home for the required licence. The boy thus obtained by his strategy the information he desired in order to ride his cycle home without a light unmolested from the "arm of the law".

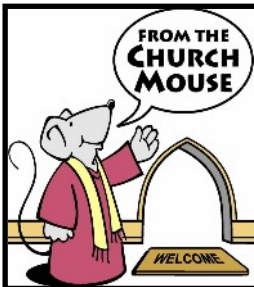

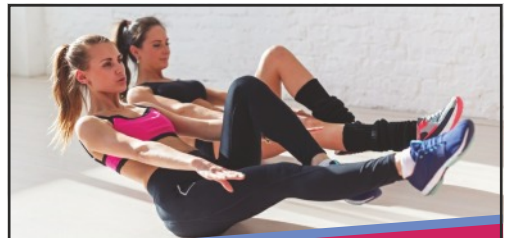
